

SECONDARY SCHOOLS ENTRANCE EXAMINATION –

FOR FIELDS OF STUDY COMPLETED BY THE MATURITA EXAMINATION

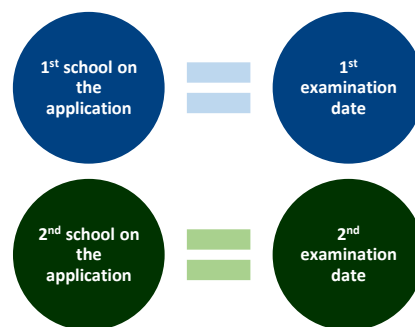
FOR FOREIGNERS WHO HAVE BEEN GRANTED TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE ACT ON SOME OF THE MEASURES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ARMED CONFLICT WITHIN THE TERRITORY OF UKRAINE

SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION

- For the first round of secondary school entrance examination, you can submit a maximum of **2 applications**. The application deadline for fields of study completed by the Maturita examination is **5 April 2022**. Submit the applications to the secondary schools of your choice – either in person or by post services or via data box to the school’s address.
- To download the necessary application form, visit the [website of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport](#).
- If you wish to apply for a waiver of the entrance examination from the Czech Language, be sure to include the **waiver request** in your application. The request should be articulated on the second page of the application in the column entitled “Schopnosti, vědomosti, zájmy, talent uchazeče a další”. In the same column you should also specify the language of your choice for the mathematics entrance examination (Czech, English or Ukrainian). Additionally, attach to the application the originals of your school reports or affidavit of your education results from the last two years.

STATE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

- The state entrance examination (also called the “jednotná přijímací zkouška”) represents a compulsory component of the acceptance procedure for fields of study completed by the Maturita examination. It accounts for at least 60% of the overall evaluation in the acceptance procedure. The overall evaluation criteria for the acceptance procedure can be found on each secondary school’s website.
- You can sit the state entrance examination **a maximum of 2 times**. On the first date, you will sit the examination at the school that you listed in first place on your application. On the second date, you will do so at the school that you listed in second place on your application. If, however, you only submit one application for a field of study with a state entrance examination, you will only be able to sit the examination once.
- The state entrance examination for four-year fields of study will take place on two dates: **12 and 13 April 2022**.
- The state entrance examination for six-year and eight-year grammar schools will take place on two dates: **19 and 20 April 2022**.
- The venue for the examination (the school’s address) will be stated in the **invitation**, which the school principal will send you electronically or otherwise.
- If you are unable to attend the entrance examination on the given date, you can send the school principal a written note of apology. Upon its acceptance, you will be allowed to sit the state entrance examination on an alternative date: **10 or 11 May 2022**.



- If you request a waiver of the entrance examination from the Czech Language in your application, you will only take the entrance examination in mathematics. Instead of the Czech Language examination, you will undergo an interview to ascertain your ability to follow the given field of study. You may choose to sit the mathematics examination in **Czech, English or Ukrainian**. Both, the test booklet and the answer sheet, will be in your chosen language. Mathematics tests from previous years are available in Czech on [the state entrance examination's official website](#). Moreover, you might also have to sit additional entrance examination according to the criteria of the given school.
- The mathematics examination will always start at **8.30 a.m.** on the given day. The time limit for the mathematics examination is **90 minutes**.
- The school will publish the list of accepted applicants within 2 business days from the release of the results, i.e., by **2 May** or **20 May 2022** at the latest, on the school's website. The results of the acceptance procedure will take into account **your best result achieved in the mathematics examination, an evaluation of your previous education and the results of the school's entrance examination, provided one was held**.
